- the need to adjust our staffing and reorganize our church structure to align with our financial deficit

AS WELL, THERE ARE MANY NEW OPPORTUNITIES:

- more than ever, our wider communities recognize the need to practically assist the needy and vulnerable—and, this is actually part of ERCF's Mission... expressing the unconditional love of Jesus to everyone!
- radical changes require re-focusing on our vision and mission—which will make us more effective
- the new guests and attendees on Sunday mornings translates into more people we are able to serve and encourage along our journey of growing in faith and love, bringing hope to our community!

Where are we going from here?

• The practical expression of Jesus' self-sacrificial love (as individuals and church family) to neighbours and friends in our local communities will become a powerful force bringing transformation!

Coming alongside people around us—with no personal agenda other than our love—will open conversations and new relationships God will use to both enrich our lives and enlarge the community of faith. *Many people need to belong before they believe!*

• As important as Sunday services are for the long-term benefit of all ages, at ERCF we say "*circles are better than rows*". By this we mean communicating within a small group setting has greater potential for transformation than sitting in a row on a Sunday morning.

Our prayer is for everyone at ERCF to connect relationally and share life with a smaller group of people.

• Refocusing attention and resources on children and youth— to address their unique problems and needs they face—means serving families is more critical than ever before. One of our tools is the Orange Curriculum.

They played hard!




What is important is that we know who holds the future.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our vision as a church is to grow in faith and love, bringing hope to our community. In fact, when the local church is healthy — it is the hope of the world! One aspect of a healthy local church is its finances.


Over the past few years, pre- and post-COVID, we have seen a decline in average monthly donations. Even through the financial deficits, we are thankful to have witnessed God's faithfulness in providing for our needs (including large donations in times of need, staff who have not taken salaries for a time, volunteers stepping up, and COVID-related benefits that helped to offset deficits).

As we do our best to steward our resources and finances moving forward, the Board of Directors and church leadership are in the process of evaluating how to refocus ERCF ministry to be more effective, cut back on expenses, reduce paid staff, and change our organizational structure. Looking across the past couple of years, we see a trend towards a yearly deficit (considering church income vs. expenditures) that we will also see in 2023, without significant change. Figures for 2023 are based on (conservatively) budgeted amounts across departments and expected expenses. In 2020 and 2021 (and to some extent, 2022), large deficits were offset thanks to COVID-related benefits. Now, change can feel uncomfortable, even scary, to some extent — but we must keep in mind that change also brings positive energy and momentum! Oftentimes, the process of change or pruning (see John 15) can be the catalyst for some really neat things.

As beloved author CS Lewis noted, "There are far better things ahead than any we leave behind".

Will you continue to pray along with us over the coming weeks and months, as we go through this process of change?

Together, let's trust in the Lord's plans for our church family, and remember our mission is to express the unconditional love of Jesus!



The Unstuck Group & The Action Team

The Unstuck Group is a church consulting group, although they don't love the term "church consulting"! They prefer 'we coach you as you lead change'. They are not here to tell us what to do but 'rather help clarify where God's called us to go and how we are going to get there'.

Several months ago, a team of ERCF people were selected to attend a 2-day session with the Unstuck group. They worked though a process to help bring alignment and focus to ERCF church ministries... together moving in the same direction.

When there is alignment, everyone in the organization has clarity around how their roles connect to the bigger picture. Team members are in tune with what success looks like, and they are able to hold loosely to methods (strategies) and much tighter to mission. Priorities are clear, and pruning is possible. (the Unstuck Group)

The process is like building a structure you need to start from the ground up. We begin with the **Foundation**. Next is the **Direction**. Then, at the top we have **Action**.

ACTION

how each ministry contributes and how we personally contribute

DIRECTION

where we are going, what success looks like, how we will accomplish our goals (Vision, Goals, Strategies)

FOUNDATION

these are the things that don't change (Core Beliefs, Mission, etc.)

FOUNDATION: what's <u>NOT</u> changing at ERCF!

- Core Beliefs
- Grace emphasis nonperformance-based relationship
- Baptism as a believer
- Our view of Scripture
- Jim's *role* will change—but he is not going away⁽ⁱ⁾
- Our view of spiritual health
- Pastor-led church model

Our Governance model (Pastoral Advisors, Board, Lead Pastor)

Elora Road Christian School has had a great start to the new school year. We welcomed three new staff, Adrian Burkhardt as our grade 5/6 and grade 1-6 French teacher, Julie Klapwyk as our grade 7/8 French teacher, and Arden Reinhart as our Educational Assistant. We were also excited to have Jen Mullett return from maternity leave to teach grades JK to 8 music and grade 5/6 math and art.

Other staff includes: Annette de Vries: JK/SK teacher Dee Butler: Grade 1/2 teacher Leslie Bauman: Grade 3/4 teacher Patti Tan: Primary Relief teacher Pam Tuck: Grade 7/8 teacher and Vice-Principal Valerie Duimering: Head of Special Education Alicia Sellers: Office Administrator Cindy Westendorp: Principal

We were also excited to welcome 10 new families and 23 new students to ERCS in September. Our enrollment now sits at 80 students and 43 families. One of our new families is from South Korea. It's exciting to see our students welcome these children into our school.

ERCS benefits from membership in two organizations. Edvance Christian Schools Association provides our school with leadership and teacher training opportunities. They also offer guidance and support to our School Governance Committee through training sessions and access to different resources such as policy and procedural documents. The Christian School Foundation draws Christian Schools and donors together. They also provide bursaries to member Christian Schools. This year ERCS received an \$8000 Belonging Bursary which allowed us to hire Arden to support the needs of our Special Education students. We also received \$10 000 in Partnership Bursaries for 5 families to help cover their tuition costs. Some of these families also qualified for the ERCS Single Parent Bursary.

ERCS also benefits from the many committed parents and volunteers who are part of our Parent Council and School Governance Committee. We are thankful for the contributions each of these individuals makes to our school. Special thanks to Rob van de Pol for installing the new fence in the schoolyard.

This past spring, our team decided we needed to move in order to give better care to our residents and implement the next phase of our vision for Elora House. We asked God to open doors and help us to find a home that would allow us to have Stage 1 and 2 in one home.

We had specific things we were looking for. Two weeks after this decision, I met a local businessman who was very interested in helping us with our housing needs. He decided to purchase a home and let us rent it for the cost of the utilities and taxes. THIS WAS A HUGE BLESSING! We now have more than double the space inside and we have a beautiful large backyard. THIS is such an amazing gift from God. We have doubled our capacity for space with the residents and will be able to keep the girls long term if they require a longer stay.

We provide their basic needs and give them the opportunity to rest, rebuild and restart their lives. They receive different forms of therapy, along with learning life skills, exercising physically daily, practice gratitude journaling and are able to engage in arts and crafts. Our program is for the mind, body and spirit. Many of our residents have experienced the love of Jesus and are exploring their faith. They have the freedom to make their own choices and we love and support them regardless if we agree with their decisions.
